I. BRIEF OVERVIEW OF BOARD ACTIVITY

- Board members conducted six meetings during this fiscal year.
- The Scope of Practice will be filed via the Procedural Rule process. Board members and volunteer professional individuals are working towards a first draft. The scope of practice will not in any way alter or affect the existing minimum *requirements for licensing* as set forth within the West Virginia Code.
- The Board carried out their responsibilities for the protection of the public pursuant to disciplinary action procedures set forth within the Legislative Rules 25CSR1. Those matters where finding of probable cause was found were appropriately resolved and reported for public use to the Health Integrity Practitioners Data Bank. ASWB is the reporting agent to HIPDB for the Board. Assistant Attorney General Katherine Campbell continues to serve as legal counsel for the Board.
- Staff members serve the needs of the general and professional public in a timely manner and effective manner. Both full time staff persons attended the annual Board & Commission training and complied with the Purchasing Card training and testing provisions.
- As revenue has continued to drop and expenses rise, the Board was forced to file an Emergency Rule with the Secretary of State. Generating additional income in the next few months is paramount to the Board's survival and ability to continue to serve West Virginia citizens. The Board followed all procedures set forth by SOS and LRMRC. The Board is required, under law, to support itself by the collection of license fees. Fees have not been increased since 2002. As of the date of this report, the comments received from those affected have been very supportive.
- Dr. Patricia O'Reilly is the WV Delegate to the Association of Social Work Boards (ASWB). Dr. O'Reilly attended the Delegate Assembly in San Antonio, Texas November 9-11, 2007. Christine Maniskas attended the June 2008 New Board Member Training organized and presented by ASWB. ASWB assumes all expenses for both of these events. The Board was honored to be represented by these members. Dr. O'Reilly has attended every November Assembly as the WV Delegate to ASWB. Continued interest and involvement strengthens our relationship with the Association as well as communications with all member jurisdictions.

VII. COMPLAINT AND DISCIPLINARY ACTION REPORT
